What worked well and what would we do differently?

What worked well:

- Feeding the community
- Got out in front of issues
- Were able to collaborate effectively with various interests and resources.
- Marshaling and coordinating the energy in the town. Rallying volunteer support.
- Folks outside the town recognize the work including on the regional and state levels
- Was able to help Albany
- Support for local businesses and institutions and their contributions to the efforts

What we would do differently:

- Reaching out to all even those who look at the world differently than we do.
- Discover resources beyond the town for more support including the Kingdom and the state contexts.
- Figure out what the social service needs are and how to fill the gaps. Use the mental health group model. Connect people to the existing resources and figure out what the gaps might be.
- Connect with people who don't want to wear masks and understand why in order to address the problem.

What are our priorities:

- Inclusivity
- Emergency response
- Long term resilience
- Increase connections
- Support the local economy
- Relationship with the town? Long term advisory committee. Group needs to discuss its role vis a vis fund raising. Community Trust?
- Create a funding mechanism that is clearly for our purposes. Within the town government or separate? Create a 501-3C with a board that has town representation? Would be a vehicle to accept donations and apply for grants.
- How to reach out to the community? Make sure the group represents diverse interests, but also bring perspectives thorough a planning process feedback process.
- Host small group discussions with folks who might not come to a meeting to get their feedback. Roundtable format. Environment that is safe for people to express their opinions.
